ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- The Secretariat of the Southern African Development Community Groundwater Management Institute (SADC-GMI) (the Recipient) will implement the GEF Sustainable groundwater management in SADC member states Project – Phase 2 (P176607, GE) (the Project) with the involvement of SADC member countries (Sub-grant recipients). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development / International Development Association (the Bank) acting as Trustee to the Global Environmental Facility (GEF) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
- SADC-GMI will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance
 with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan
 (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for
 each of these.
- 3. SADC-GMI will also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the Environmental and Social Framework (ESF) and referred to in this ESCP, such as Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMP), and Stakeholder Engagement Plans (SEP), and the timelines specified in those Environmental & Social (E&S) documents.
- 4. SADC-GMI is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the sub-grant recipients referenced in 1. above.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Bank by SADC-GMI as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the Bank and SADC-GMI, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, SADC-GMI will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and SADC-GMI. SADC will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, SADC-GMI shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
